Is your child crying during Mass?

Children are always very welcomed at Mass.

The following are logistic advices. Common sense should always be the main drive. Very small children—infants and toddlers—are quite capable of making a great deal of noise, but they generally do so for some reason: because they are uncomfortable, hungry, or tired, for example. If they are making a noise, it may be possible to quiet them there and then, but very often a parent will have to take them outside: not just for the sake of other people, but to meet the child's needs.

In our churches there are areas where you can take your child.

Saint Paul's: back room with glass panelling.

Saint Thomas': Meeting Room. Most Holy Name's: former sacristy.

Standing outside a church with a small child is, after all, a way of serving God, and you are "morally present" at Mass as far as meeting your own obligation to attend is concerned.

Soft toys should be preferred to be brought into the church.

Respecting the holiness of our buildings

It has been noticed that, after Mass, hymnbooks have been left on the altar of Blessed Peter Wright at St Paul's church. Here is a gentle reminder to treat the scared objects of the church with reverence and respect. No one should misuse the important sacred spaces in our churches: i.e. Altar, Priest's chair and Ambo (commonly called lectern), these three objects form the Sanctuary of the church. Other important objects are side altars, the Baptismal Font and the Tabernacle.
